Voting in Colorado is easy and convenient. All registered voters will receive a ballot in the mail beginning October 16th. To make sure you're registered at your current address or to update your registration, go to www.govotecolorado.com

WHAT IS A "VSPC"?

A VSPC is a **Voter Service and Polling Center**. You can visit a VSPC in your county to register, update your registration or address, drop off your ballot, get a replacement ballot, vote in person, or solve any Election-related problems.

VSPCs open beginning October 30th and are open through 7:00 PM on Election Day, Tuesday, November 7th. Check locations and times on the other side of this flyer or at www.justvotecolorado.org

WHAT IF I STILL NEED TO REGISTER TO VOTE?

Until Monday, October 30th, you can **go online to register to vote or update your registration** and you will still receive your ballot in the mail by Election Day.

After Monday, October 30th, you can **visit a VSPC to register and vote in person**. You can register to vote up to and including Election Day at any VSPC. To register online through Monday, October 30th, visit www.govotecolorado.com.
