



BOULDER COUNTY VOTING INFORMATION



Voting in Colorado is easy and convenient. All registered voters will receive a ballot in the mail beginning October 16th. To make sure you're registered at your current address or to update your registration, go to www.govotecolorado.com

WHAT IS A "VSPC"?

A VSPC is a **Voter Service and Polling Center**. You can visit a VSPC in your county to register, update your registration or address, drop off your ballot, get a replacement ballot, vote in person, or solve any Election-related problems.

VSPCs open beginning October 30th and are open through 7:00 PM on Election Day, Tuesday, November 7th. Check locations and times on the other side of this flyer or at www.justvotecolorado.org

WHAT IF I STILL NEED TO REGISTER TO VOTE?

Until Monday, October 30th, you can go online to register to vote or update your registration and you will still receive your ballot in the mail by Election Day.

After Monday, October 30th, you can visit a VSPC to register and vote in person. You can register to vote up to and including Election Day at any VSPC. To register online through Monday, October 30th, visit www.govotecolorado.com.

DO I NEED TO BRING AN ID WITH ME?

If you vote in person, you MUST bring an ID with you, but it doesn't have to be a photo ID!
